Reston, Virginia – November 15, 2017 – [GTL](#) announced today that its link analysis application, [GTL Data IQ](#), has been used to identify a suspect in a homicide that recently occurred at a large correctional facility in the United States.

When a major incident, such as a homicide, happens at a correctional facility, steps are taken to secure the area: the facility is locked down, visits are cancelled, and additional staff members are called in to assist. As the investigation begins, investigative staff begin gathering evidence, conducting interviews, and in some facilities, engaging GTL’s intelligence analysts. Analysts play a crucial role in any investigation and are even more valuable in security-related incidents.

In response to a recent homicide, one of GTL’s customer facilities engaged their on-site GTL analysts to assist in mining data while investigators tended to other time-sensitive tasks. The analysts were quick to engage, leveraging the GTL Data IQ application to map out the victim’s network. Focusing in on an area of suspicious connectivity, analysts identified the suspect and informed correctional officials, who corroborated the information and seized the suspected offender from his cell.
